**Junior Scholars in Emerging Military Technology Workshop  
SMU Dedman School of Law

This workshop offers a unique opportunity for junior scholars\* writing on the legal, policy, and ethical aspects of military technology to receive detailed commentary on their work from established scholars in a focused workshop setting. Participants are expected to cover their own travel costs and commit to attend the entire workshop. SMU will provide hotel accommodations and meals, including an opening reception and workshop dinner.

\* Eligible junior scholars have seven or fewer years of full-time teaching experience. Practitioners considering joining the legal academy are eligible to submit. Joint work is eligible so long as all authors are junior scholars. Only one paper may be submitted by each junior-scholar applicant.

Eligible papers may be works in progress but must be complete drafts of a minimum of 10,000 words and not more than 25,000 words. Papers may not already have been selected for publication or previously published.
