

Dr. Siobhán McInerney-Lankford is Senior Policy Officer in the World Bank Operations Policy and Country Services Vice-Presidency (OPCS). There she works for the Nordic Trust on human rights (NTF) advising on human rights law and policy in World Bank activities and partnerships. From 2002-2010 she served as Counsel in the World Bank Legal Vice-Presidency (LEGVPU) advising primarily on human rights law and safeguard policies. She is the World Bank's representative on the OECD Development Assistance Committee Human Rights Task Team (having chaired the Task Team from 2006-2008), the World Bank representative on the UN High-Level Task Force on the Right to Development and she regularly represents the World Bank at the UN, EU and other international fora.

Before joining the World Bank Dr. McInerney-Lankford worked in private practice in Washington D.C., focusing on public interest litigation and administrative law. She has published extensively on human rights law and co-authored *The Human Right to Water: Legal and Policy Dimensions* (2004), World Bank Studies on *Human Rights Indicators in Development* (2010) and *Human Rights and Climate Change: A Review of the International Legal Dimensions* (2011). Her human rights law experience includes work with the U.S. House of Representatives on the Subcommittee on International Operations and Human Rights, U.S. Federal District Court, Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights, Irish Council for Civil Liberties and Free Legal Advice Centers (Dublin).

Dr. McInerney-Lankford holds an LL.B. from Trinity College, Dublin (First Class Honors), a B.C.L. and D.Phil. from Oxford University and an LL.M. from Harvard Law School. She is a member of the State Bar of Rhode Island and the American Bar Association, as well as the American Society of International Law. In both 2010 and 2011 she was named among the *Irish Legal 100* published by the *Irish Voice* newspaper.
